We are seeking an experienced and qualified individual to support the programme on a substitute basis with the potential for increased hours and responsibility in the future.

The Extended Care Programme takes place **from Monday to Friday, from 15:30 to 18:00**. However, the working days and hours may vary depending on the school's needs.

Main responsibilities:

- To support the children and provide for their well-being in a safe and caring environment
- To be proactive and support the planning of age appropriate activities
- To be aware of child protection issues and observe the school's safeguarding procedures
- To ensure that activities undertaken are delivered with due regard for the health and safety of the children and in accordance with good childcare practice
- To liaise with the Extended Care Coordinator and other school administration
